The survey will look at views from transplant patients who have had one or more of the following:




- Heart

- Pancreas




- Simultaneous pancreas-kidney

We follow the law on how to protect your information.

It is called the **General Data Protection** regulation (GDPR)



We will not use information that would identify who you are.

This is things like:

- your name
- your address
- your email address



We will look closely at the answers you give us.



We will write a report on the things you tell us.



The Scottish Government rules on keeping information is that it should be kept for **3 years.**

We will look at your personal information after **1 year**.



We will decide if it can be safely deleted.

Any other information which does not identify you will be kept for as long as we need it.



Your information is kept secure and private.
